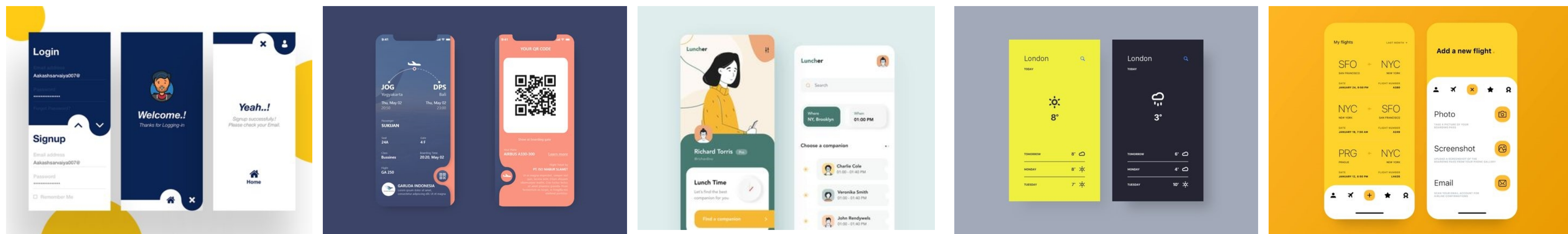

Designing a digital interpretation of a California driver license.

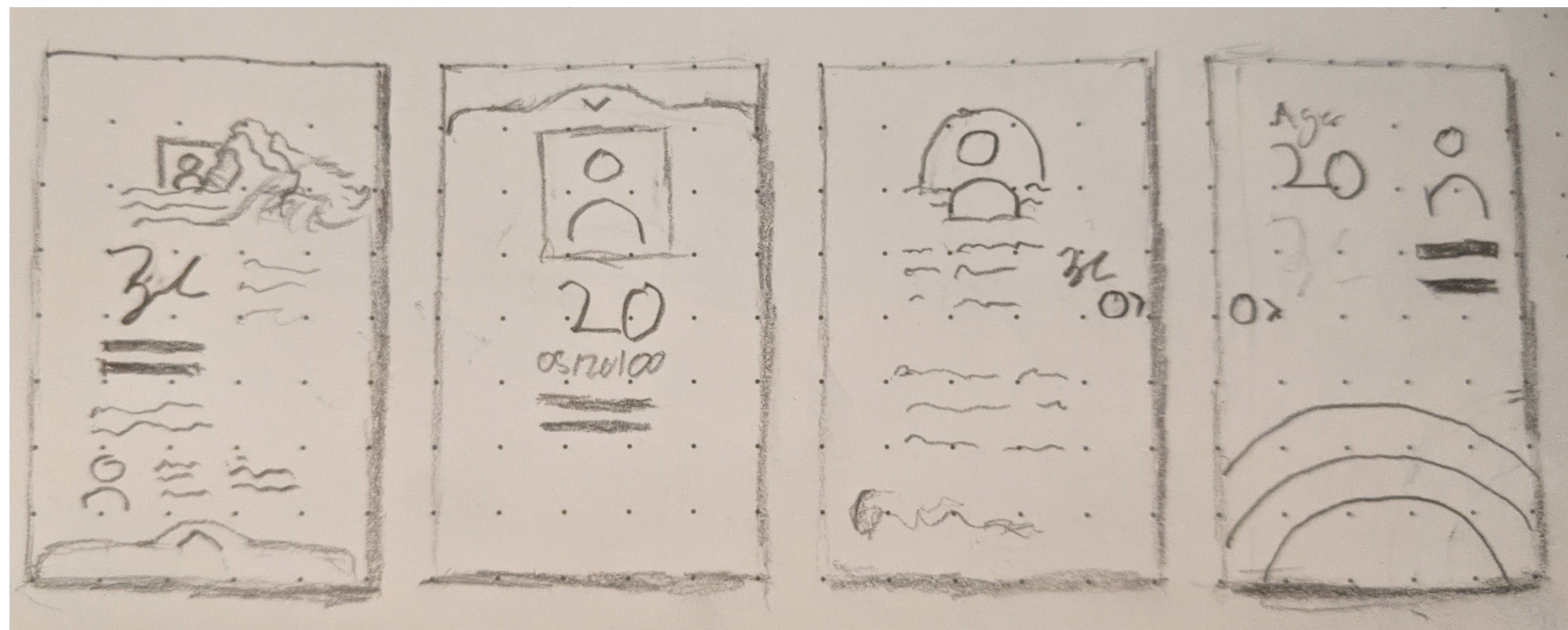
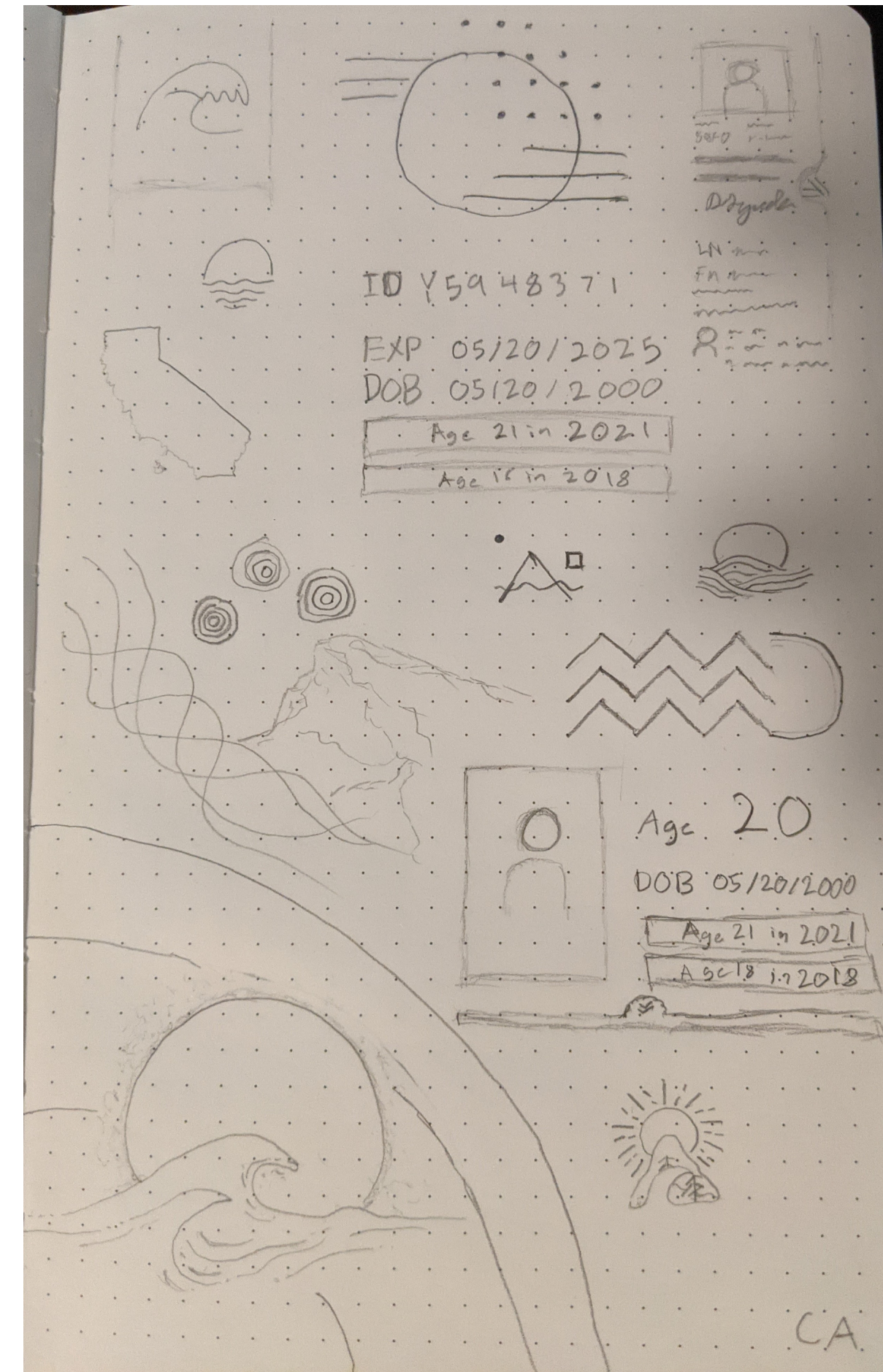
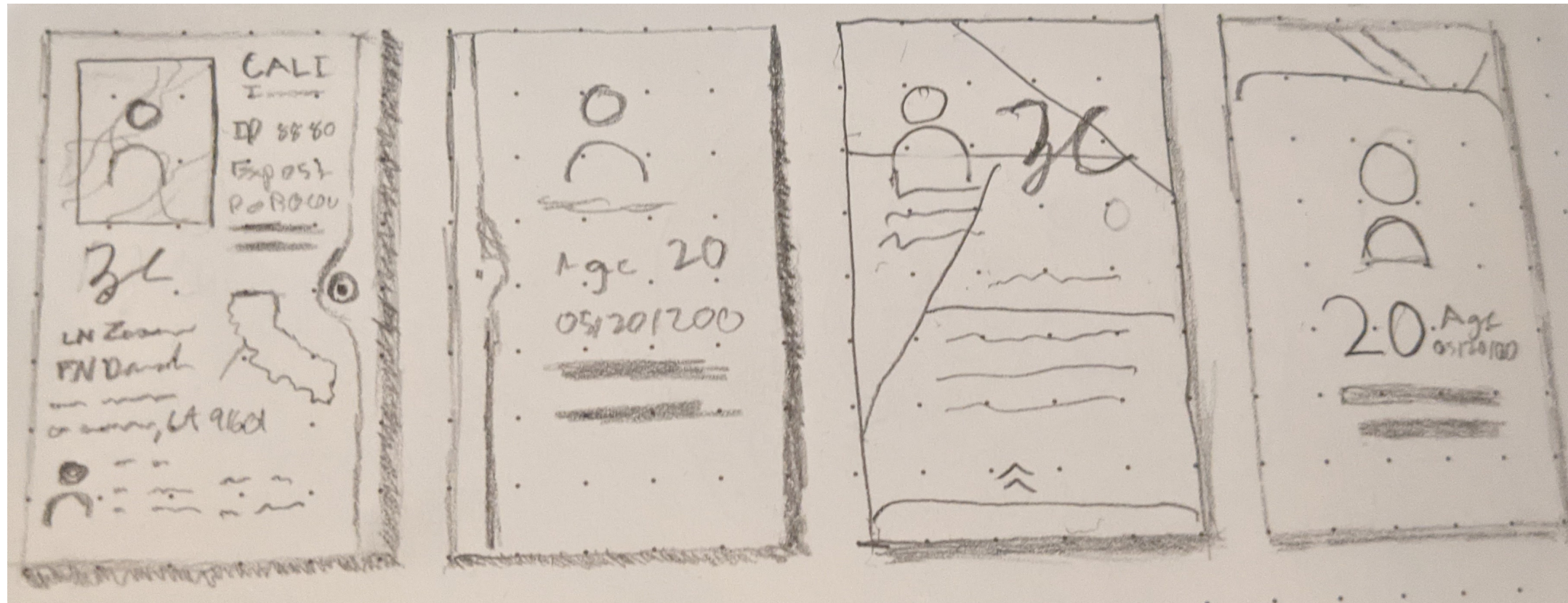
How can information be displayed in an easy to understand way, alongside multiple visual elements in order to present the design as the "essence of California"

My research led me to realize the importance of accessibility between every possible state. With there only being 2 for the license, I needed to make swapping between them an easy process to understand.

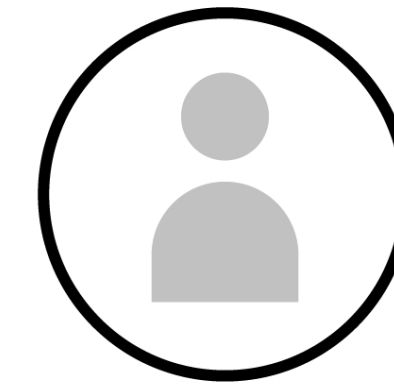


Concept Sketches

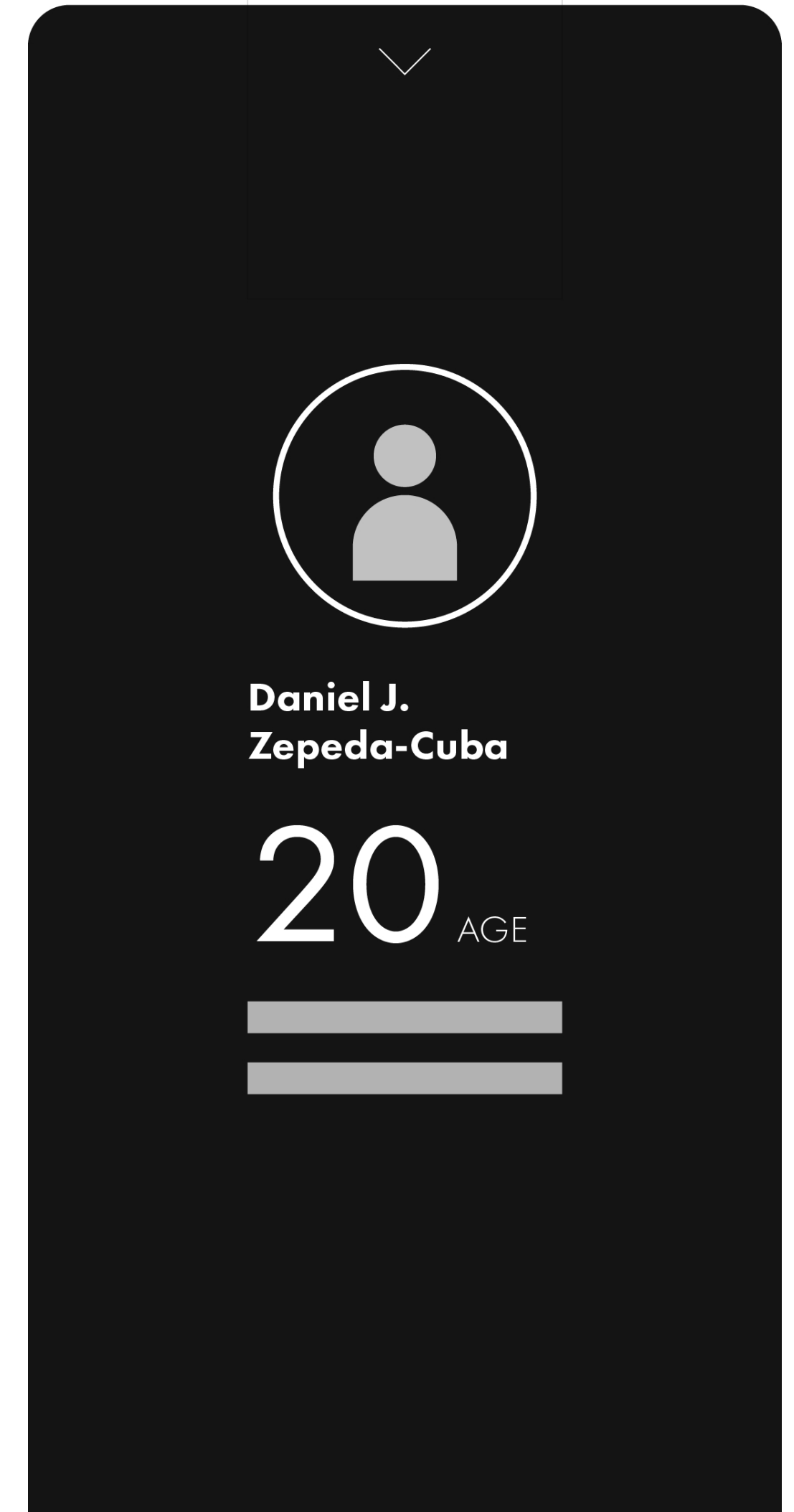

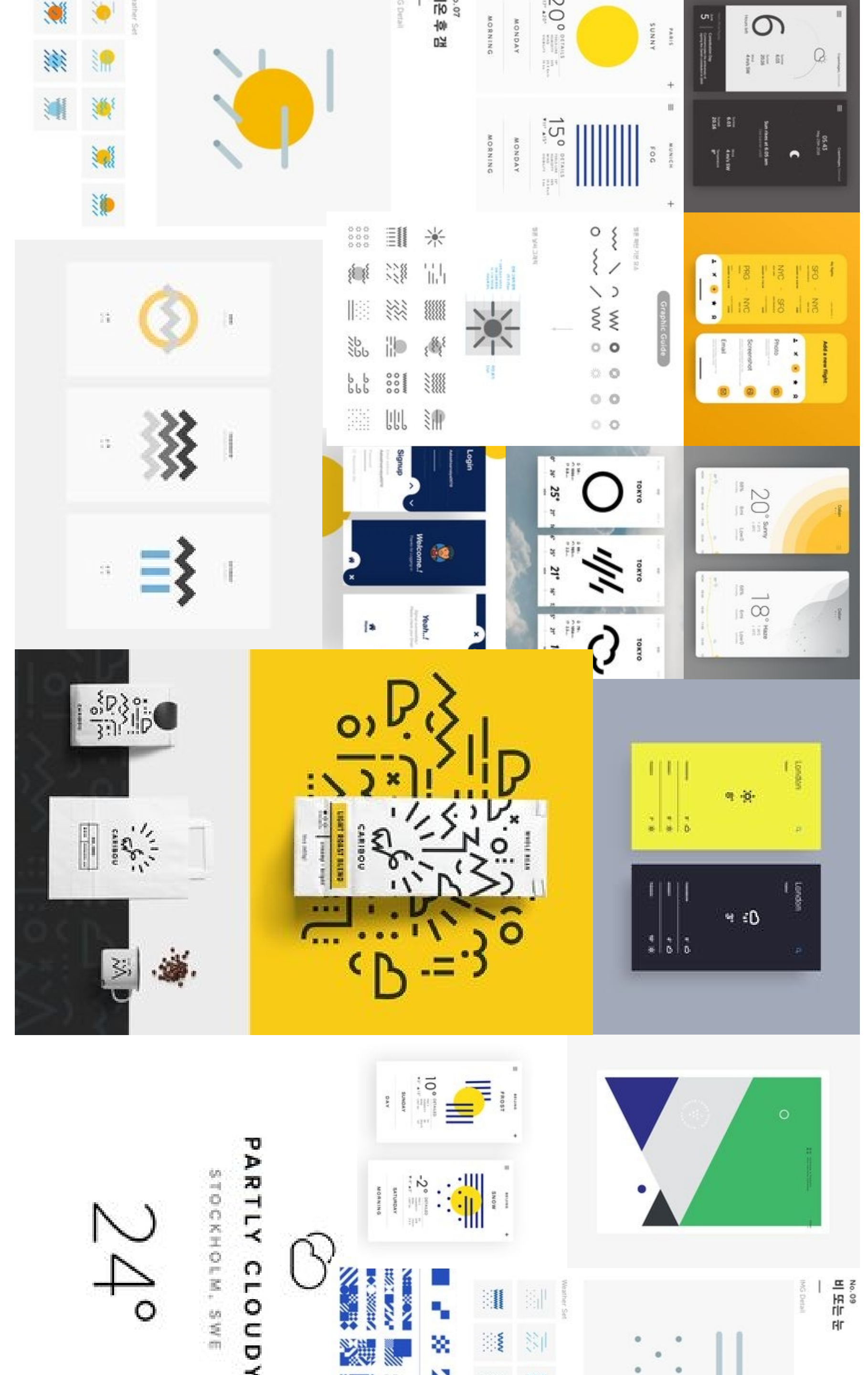

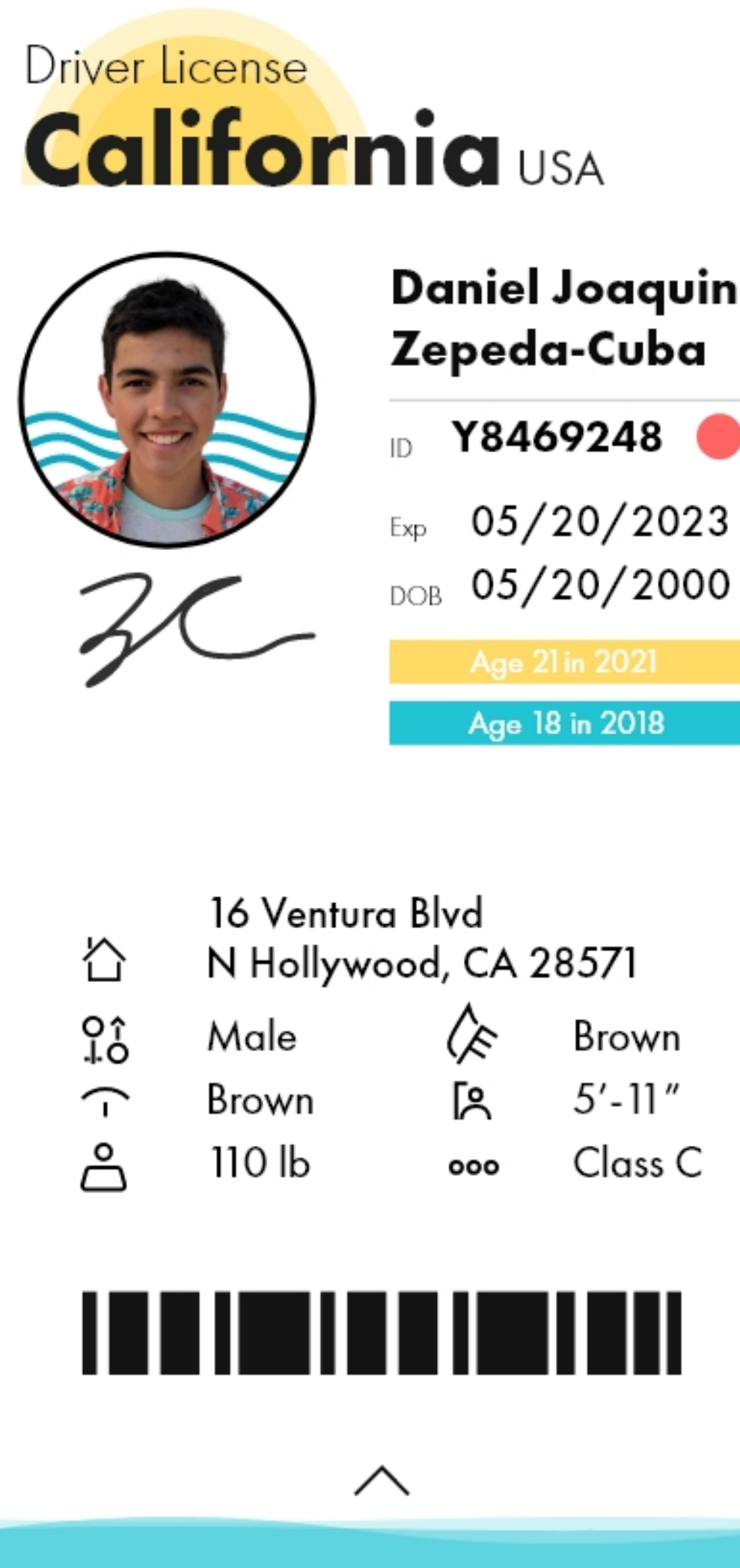
Golden State Geometry

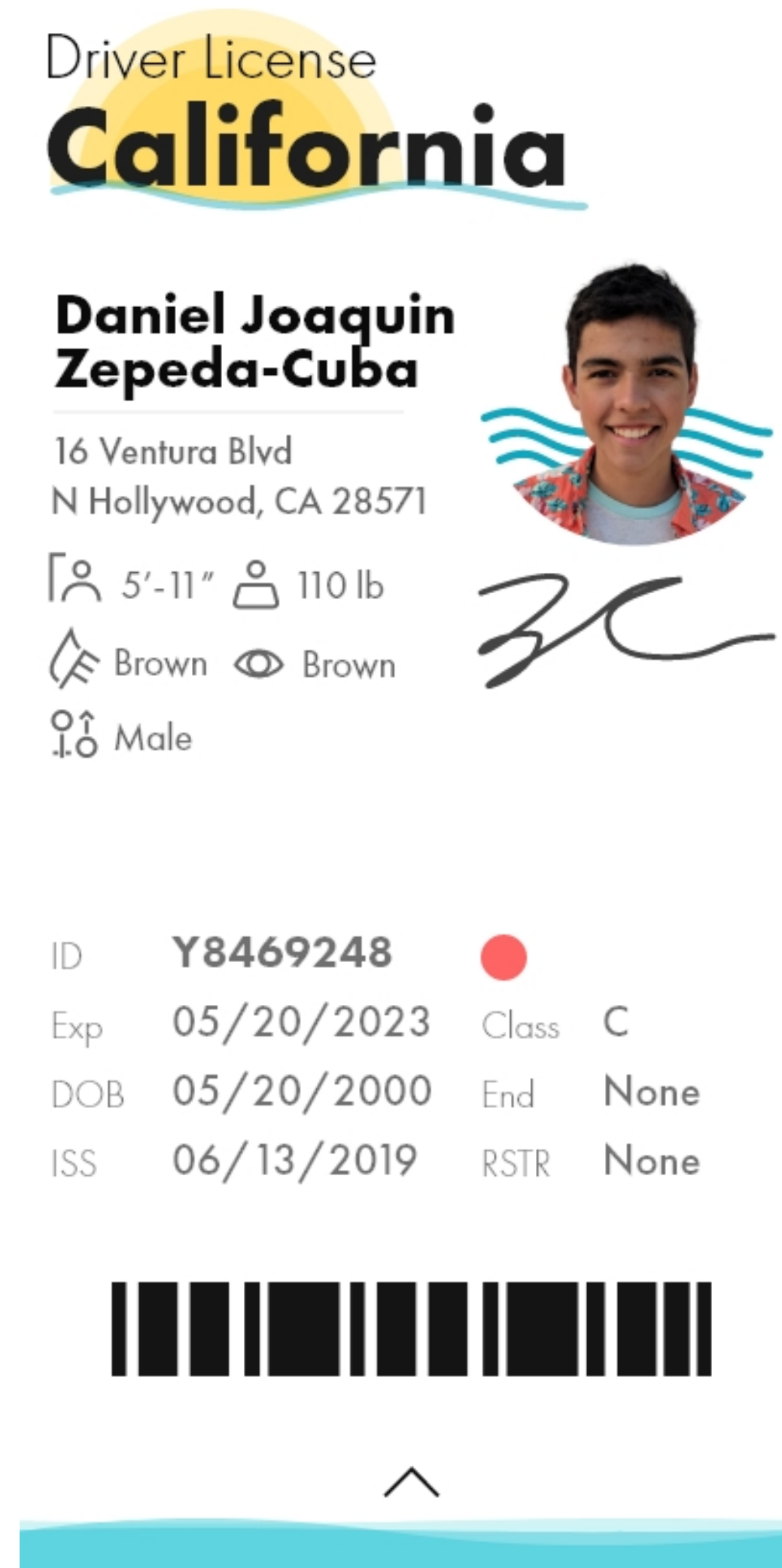
The first visual interpretation

I decided to utilize a limited color palette, featuring only the bright yellow of the California sun and the welcoming blue to represent the states beaches.



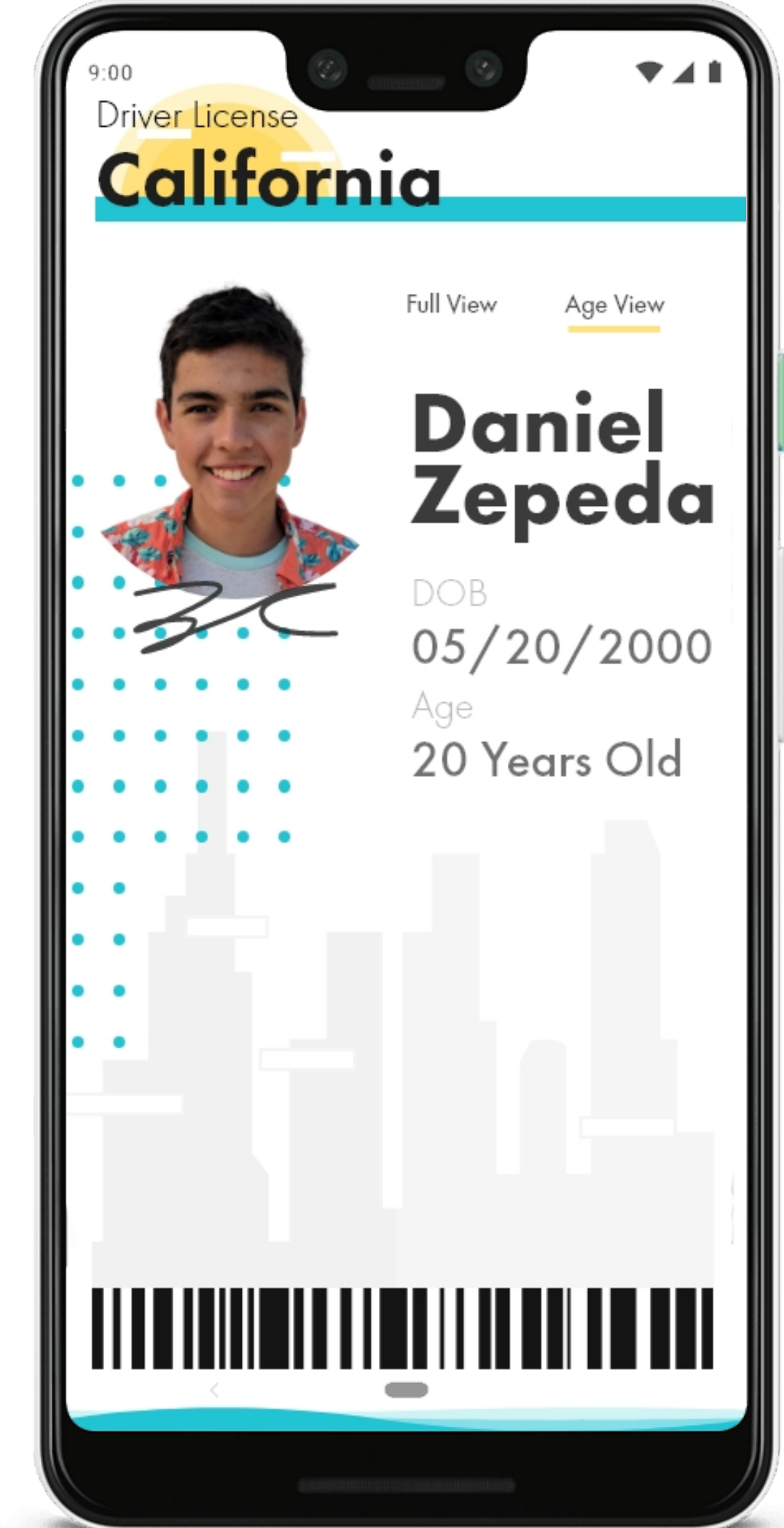
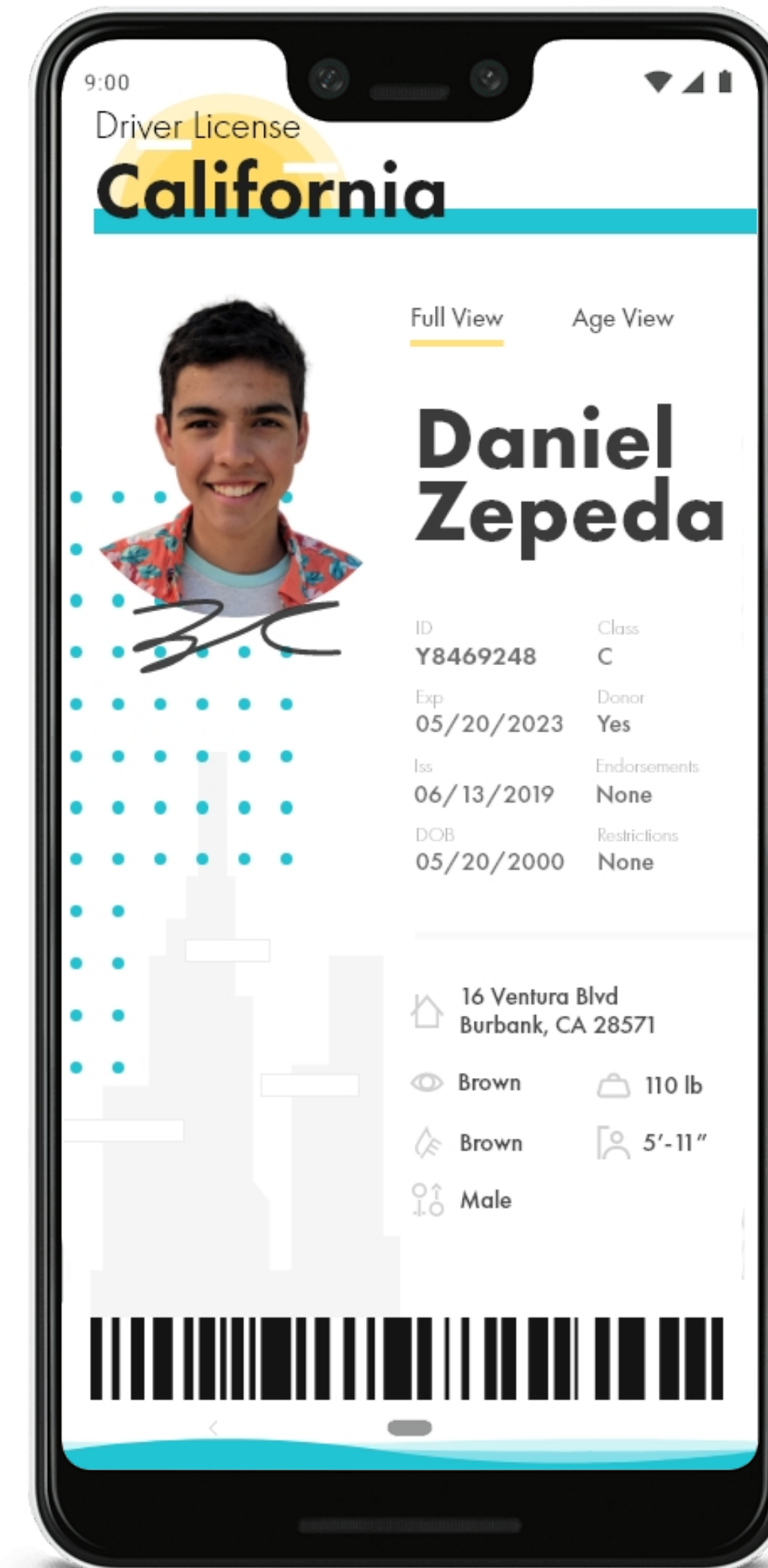
The second visual interpretation
